

Thank you for your recent letter.

I'm a big fan of the Final Fantasy games myself. You'll be happy to hear that Final Fantasy Legend II and Final Fantasy Adventure for Game Boy are still being made, but they may be a little difficult to locate. So are we going to see any more Final Fantasy games? Well, I hate to speculate, so I'm going to advise going right to the source. You might have heard about some of Square Soft's plans for this year. I know it sounds hard to believe, but I think the projects they have planned may actually surpass Final Fantasy III (my all-time favorite role-playing game!). The 32-meg Chrono Trigger will be coming out in September. It utilizes time travel, science-fiction, and fantasy adventure to create a very original role-playing

game. The game's hero, Chrono, is transported into the past and ends up altering the course of history, and with it the future as well. The integral time travel element of the game enables players to alter the game by changing the past, giving players multiple endings and excellent repeat game play value. There are mini-quests, a huge cast of characters, realistic time travel, non-linear game play, and more active and interactive battle scenes than Final Fantasy III!

That's not all. You can also expect to see Secret of Evermore in November. This will be the first role-playing game to utilize Advanced Computer Modeling, the same animation technique that produced the striking graphics in Donkey Kong Country. Lastly, Square Soft will be bringing out the long awaited sequel, Secret of Mana II. I can't wait to try this one out! While Square Soft does not currently have a Final Fantasy game announced, it looks like they're going to have their best year ever!
